### **Global Health in Context: Linking Census Data to Health Surveys using IPUMS, DHS and IHGIS**

**Room F** This workshop will introduce free integrated microdata and place-based aggregate data from IPUMS ([www.ipums.org](http://www.ipums.org)), focusing on a new feature facilitating linkages between Demographic and Health Survey (DHS) records and contextual data from population and agricultural censuses. IPUMS DHS provides individual records from DHS program surveys conducted around the globe, with variables harmonized across time and place. IPUMS IHGIS provides consistently formatted tables of results from population and agricultural censuses worldwide. Both data collections include fine-grained geographic detail. DHS includes latitude/longitude coordinates for cluster points approximating the residential locations of survey participants, and IHGIS includes fine-grained subnational administrative and statistical units. The new linking feature uses the DHS cluster points to identify the corresponding census unit where each respondent lives and provides

the IHGIS unit code as a variable on DHS records. Census data tables from IHGIS are then easily joined to the records based on the unit code. The fine-grained geography and richness of these collections facilitate a wide variety of interdisciplinary research. The workshop will include a hands-on component allowing participants to download and explore linked data from IPUMS DHS and IHGIS for an environmental health case study. We will also share examples of the types of research exploring health in context that could be enabled by these linkages. All our welcome. No registration required.

**New Data and Tools to Study the Demography of Social Mobility**

**Room P** The workshop presents new data sources and methodological tools to study social mobility from a demographic perspective. First, the workshop introduces the novel DECIPHE Contextual Database, developed to enable cross-national and multilevel analyses of the contextual drivers of intergenerational homeownership persistence across Europe. Second, we will present a newly collected cross-national dataset from four countries on housing tenure decision-making, with a particular focus on intergenerational factors, outlining its motivation, key innovations, and the design of the survey and questionnaire, and explaining opportunities for researchers to access and use the data. Third, we will host a hands-on session introducing continuous-time microsimulation as a method for modeling and simulating life courses in the social sciences at the cohort or population level. The workshop also aims to bring together researchers interested in these topics and to ignite exchange across projects and

**Room A** The meeting time is from 9.00 - 11.00 This meeting will take the form of a round table discussion covering a variety of emerging topics in register-based fertility research, and actively aims to stimulate cross-national collaborations. In this meeting, we will discuss emerging research areas and innovations and challenges in register-based fertility research. We will discuss opportunities and the challenges using register data, and building on our established practice of investing in collaborations

(<https://www.eaps.nl/page/registerbased-projects>) we will focus on the potential for new collaborations.” The session will begin with a brief introduction to the group, outlining its goals and mission with a strong emphasis on fostering collaboration.

The discussion will then cover both methodological and substantive issues related to the use of register data in fertility research. Methodological topics include challenges arising from cross-national differences in data structures, coverage of diverse population subgroups, and the integration of survey and register data. Substantively, the session will explore how collaborative use of register data can help address key gaps in current research, including the relationships between

uncertainty (e.g. economic conditions, housing, trust) and fertility, trends in late fertility and childlessness, dynamics of cohabitation and partnerships, and the role of social networks in shaping fertility outcomes.
